Do you have mother's patience?

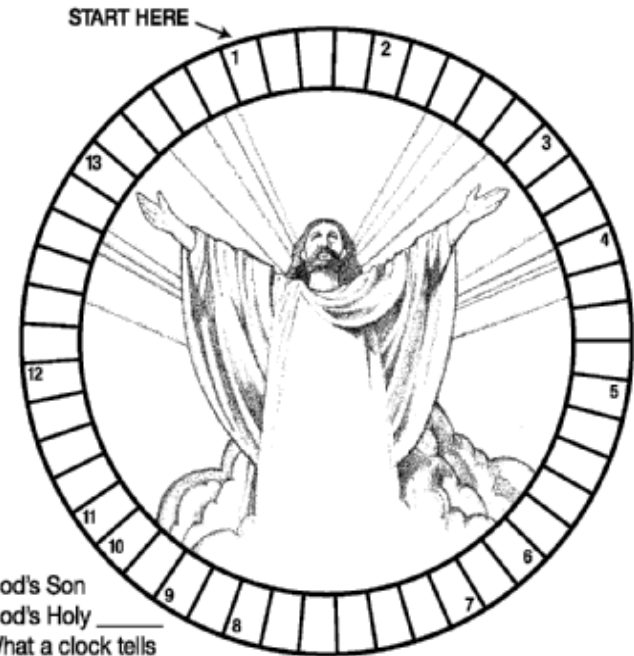
